## Conclusions and next steps

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## CSR/ES Roadmap – state of play

- Published and website running
- Transparency on action details and intermediate results to be improved
- Three workshops held in autumn 2013 – resource intensive, but progress made!
- Ambitious plan for 2014 – Coordination group meets this afternoon to align priorities
- We welcome **new organisations to join**

## Emerging issues

- Storage of exposure scenarios
  - Proposal to allow web based storage to help to target the ES better; not to overload DUs
  - Would require: (Generic) ES all available, ESCom functioning, common repositories (for ES)
  - hosted by: “official body”? Company?
  - To be clarified whether in line with REACH text
- DU ES conformity tool
  - ECETOC TRA based calculation in Excel (HH + ENV)
  - Outcome: Scaling or DU CSR
  - Validation needed

## Progress since ENES4

- Exposure scenario short titles
  - Further exemplification carried out, rules refined
  - Still further testing needed – **volunteers**? Discussions will continue on the third identifier, use descriptor system review
- ESCom and ESComXML
  - New governance structure; contracts in the signature process for both phrases and IT part
  - Foreseen to continue until 2015 when review of resources etc. and possibility of continuation
  - Revised phrase catalogue expected in spring 2014
  - Apart from xml format, there is a need to develop software allowing the exchange of the phrases in the xml. Development only starting.

## Progress since ENES4

- SCEDs (Specific Consumer Exposure Determinants)
  - Document the more realistic conditions of use than in conservative ECETOC TRA
  - Emerging reality – **those sectors not yet started are invited to do so**
  - Potentially a need to have the SCEDs reviewed
  - ECHA is enabling the use of SCEDs in Chesar 2.3

## Mixtures methodologies

- Transparency of all methodologies to be increased
  - Assumptions, justifications, limitations
  - Limit when crossing over to the DU CSA
  - How to proceed when the information needed is not available
- In the REACH framework, the link between the registrants' CSAs and the safety advice that the formulator provides must not be broken
- Formulators are in a key position
  - To generate the information elements for the registrants
  - To enable receiving good quality information from them after registration
- Merge the advantages of top-down and bottom up
