



Official Journal

- Provides formal, comprehensive texts of Decisions, Regulations and Judgements
- Powerful search tool
- Includes many documents of peripheral interest
- Does not include guidance documents or databases
- Available in all official EU languages
- Legal texts often not easy to comprehend due to legal language and cross-references

- Indirect navigation
- https://circabc.europa.eu
- "Browse categories", "Health and Food Safety", "Biocides", "Library"
- Navigation between pages is peculiar
- Public access to biocides information but much of the CIRCABC site has restricted access, *e.g.* "Information"
- Not easy to identify new documents
- Mixture of the useful and the obsolete so be careful information may be outdated or only proposals

- Substances not approved.....

- Competent authorities, helpdesks and stakeholders
- Documents finalised at CA meetings agreed positions on some specific topics, including under BPD!
- Practical Guides Special Series on data sharing, letters of access and consortium
- Review programme for existing active substances
- Study reports miscellaneous documents including information on fees and sustainable use



- Comprehensive website
- Covers not only BPR but also REACH, CLP and PIC
- Provides a lot of useful guidance, databases, process descriptions and helpful documents
- Describes work of Biocidal Products Committee
- Regularly updated
 - SIGN UP FOR WEEKLY NEWSLETTER
- Can be difficult to find what you want



ECHA BPR information - Regulations

- Understanding BPR describes major concepts
- Legislation consolidated version of BPR, subsidiary legislation, specific decisions, BPD legal texts
- Processes active substance approval, biocidal product authorisation, technical equivalence, Article 95 compliance, data sharing,
- Links to IT tools
- Nanomaterials
- Treated articles
- Research and Development



ECHA BPR information – other pages

- Home page news headlines, public consultations, events, new guidance, webinars
- Addressing Chemicals of Concern active substances which are candidates for substitution
- Information on Chemicals databases on active substances, biocidal products and Article 95 list
- Support guidance documents (look for the BPR information, as mostly REACH)
- Support emission scenario documents, R4BP3 links, SME information



ECHA - Finding Information

- Website reflects ECHA approach based on data and processes
- Will only tell what is known will not (cannot) answer unresolved issues
- When trying to find something:
 - search box often not very helpful



- easier to look at each main page for required information
- keep clicking and look for likely useful links down, left and right
- outline of site structure at bottom of each page
- REACH and CLP pages can provide useful information on substances



ECHA - Helpdesk

- The ECHA Helpdesk advises on BPR, CLP, PIC and REACH, although national helpdesks are first point of contact
- Helpdesk supports ECHA IT tools, such as R4BP 3
 - Learn how to use R4BP3 (and that includes authorities) or pay somebody who knows what they are doing
 - R4BP3 needs to work 24/7 (with limited maintenance windows) with support every business day
- Helpdesk needs to provide same-day solutions to simple errors or problems
- Default 15 day message irritates users and discredits ECHA



Help me!

- Everybody has different needs
- Different knowledge, problems, questions, language, approach
- Some questions have no answers or several answers
 - Experience from BPD carried over to BPR, but policies and processes mainly developed for rodenticides, insecticides and wood preservatives may not be applicable to disinfectants and preservatives or in the new legislative framework
 - Little previous consideration of issues specific to disinfectants such as efficacy and commodities
 - No experience of new features of BPR such as *in situ* generation of active substances, biocidal product families and treated articles



Conclusions

- A great deal of information is available on-line
- Knowing where to look is sometimes a problem
- Keeping up to date is important
- Specific cases will always raise questions need to discuss with relevant evaluating authority
- Need workable solutions to unresolved issues and guidance available when needed
- It's improving!
